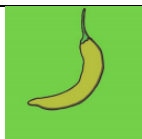
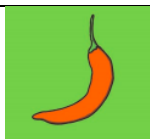

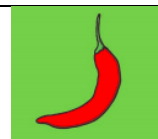
Practise your spellings at home. Choose your chilli challenge level! Remember you can do your spelling using felt-tip pens, rainbow writing or learn them through games.

<p>u-e</p> <p>Recall the magic 'e' rule</p> <p>The 'e' at the end of the word is a signal that means the previous vowel (usually the first vowel) is long. The 'u' in the word 'mule' has a long sound because it ends with the magic 'e'</p>	<p><i>Adding -ing, -ed, -er, -est and -y to words of one syllable ending in a single consonant letter after a single vowel letter</i></p> <p>The last consonant letter of the root word is doubled to keep the /æ/, / /, /ε /, / / ɪ o and /ʌ/ sound (i.e. to keep the vowel 'short').</p> <p>Exception: The letter 'x' is never doubled: mixing, mixed, boxer, sixes.</p>	<p><i>The /z/ sound spelt s</i></p> <p>The 'zh' sound is spelt with an 's' in some words such as television pleasure</p>
