As you learnt yesterday, Roald Dahl, the author of George's Marvellous Medicine used lots of different techniques to make his writing interesting. Another one of these is alliteration. This is when an author uses words that begin with the same sound in the same sentence.



Examples of alliteration



She sells seashells down by the seashore. Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.

Your challenge is to think of as many different alliteration sentences as you can. They could be short phrases with a few words or challenge yourself to write a really long sentence!

e.g. cuddly cat

e.g. Sam sees six silmy, smooth, silthering shakes.
